Key Vocabulary

Definition

Running stitch



A simple stitch that goes in and out of the material.

Zip

A device used to open and close clothes or bags.

Button

A small, flat object that closes clothes or bags by going through a slit or a loop.

Seam

A fold made by sewing or joining two pieces of material together.

Textile

Different types of fabrics that are usually made by weaving materials together.

Applique

Stitching a small piece of fabric onto a larger one to make a pattern or design.
